Spontaneous prayers or A faith-based song

## MONTHLY CHILDREN'S LITURGY IS BACK

After a brief hiatus, we are once again happy to invite families with young children to join us for our Monthly Children's Liturgy. These are Masses where children act as ushers, readers, and gift bearers and children are invited to sit in the sanctuary for a "kid-friendly" homily. The Children's Liturgy takes place October thru May generally on the first Saturday of the month (though there are exceptions) at 4pm. Some of the Liturgies are designated as special Masses to honor a certain group of children. Available volunteers then take the food to the facility located next to the Basilica in Baltimore and serve the meal on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of each month. I thought it was appropriate since all of us need to change in relating peacefully with others (especially in this time of Lent!) 7 thoughts from Jeanne (Group Magazine, Sept/Oct, '07)

1. *Follow the 101% Principle.* Find the 1% you can honestly agree with and give 100% at the beginning of the conversation to that. Half the battle is defused & won if the other person feels listened to & understood.
2. *Always love people more than opinions.* Enough said.
3. *Don't drop a bomb when a slingshot will do.* In other words, don't overreact
4. *Honestly check your own attitude.* Are you having regular conflicts with a lot of people? Could be you!
5. *Give the other person the benefit of the doubt.* We don't know or see what is going on with the person.
6. *Don't let yourself become defensive.* Voice tone and body language important!
7. *Learn to be flexible.*
