Spontaneous prayers or A faith-based song

Dear Parishioners,

We recently received the following letter from FISH Of Howard County:

*Dear Monsignor Luca and St. Louis Friends:*

*FISH of Howard County wishes to express our sincerest appreciation for the support that the St. Louis Community has provided to us over the past year. The generous Poor Box collection that was designated for our benefit, the portion of the monthly St. Louis Food Collection, the foods collected by the Religious Education families, the support of the Knights of Columbus, the response of the Divine Mercy Committee and the continued support from various other St. Louis Church Groups and individuals, as well as numerous St. Louis parishioners who serve as FISH volunteers, have made it possible for FISH to provide approximately 22,000 individual meals to the hungry and less fortunate of Howard County during this past year.*

*It is sometimes difficult for the residents of our affluent county to comprehend that there are families, who for various but very legitimate reasons, find themselves in need of the type of assistance that is provided by FISH. In addition to the food that is delivered to the homes of those in need, financial contributions from benefactors such as St. Louis, have made it possible for us to provide over \$19,500 of assistance for the payment of utility and rental bills.*

*In addition FISH, an ALL VOLUNTEER organization, has established a Pharmacy Assistance Program, funded by grant money, fund raisers and donations, that has provided approximately \$20,000 annually for emergency medications. 97% of all donated dollars go directly to the assistance of those with legitimate needs. Many of the circumstances encountered in dealing with families and individuals in these various situations offer a true sense of fulfillment and you, the St. Louis Church Community, must certainly share in that reward.*
