#### The Word of God

Choose one of next Sunday's readings. One person reads the scripture aloud as others are attentive to a word, phrase, or theme that is meaningful to them. Allow for a minute of silent reflection. Have another person read the same scripture a second time.

#### Faith Sharing

Begin with an open ended question such as "What strikes you from this reading?" and/or you can use the "Reflection Question" found on our website or bulletin. Allow time for reflection & sharing.

#### Closing Prayer

At the end of the faith sharing, invite participants to pray aloud for any particular petitions or praises they may have. Feel free to close with: The Lord's Prayer or Spontaneous prayers or a faith-based song.

#### Reflection Question for Next Sunday, January 31, 2010

How quickly the crowd turns on Jesus! They are "amazed at his gracious words" announcing that he is the fulfillment of God's promise through the ages. Amazed until they realize that they cannot expect preferential treatment just because he grew up in their midst. Then they want to throw him off a cliff. Has anything ever happened to you to challenge your idea of God?

Lobby Night is an advocacy event that gives Catholic voters the opportunity to speak with their State elected officials about Social Justice issues, like support for women in challenging pregnancies, tax help for non-public schools, clarifying what "marriage" means. Full range of topic will be available as time draws nearer.

**DO NOT BE AFRAID!** Your presence alone is invaluable: you can just **BE THERE** while someone else does the talking!

Lobby Night lasts from 3pm to 8pm; we provide buses from St Louis. **WATCH** this space for information on registering – we need to know how many buses we need and the Maryland Catholic Conference needs to know who is coming so they schedule appointments with the legislators.

**HEALTH CARE REFORM – ALERT:** As long-time advocates of health care reform, the U.S. Catholic Bishops continue to make the moral case that genuine health care reform must protect the life, dignity, consciences and health of all, especially the poor and vulnerable. Health care reform should not advance a pro-abortion agenda in our country. • On November 7, the U.S. House of Representatives passed major health care reform that reaffirms the essential, longstanding and widely supported policy against using federal funds for elective abortions and includes positive measures on affordability and immigrants. • On December 24, the U.S. Senate rejected this policy and passed health care reform that requires federal funds to help subsidize and promote health plans that cover elective abortions. All purchasers of such plans will be required to pay for other people's abortions through a separate payment solely to pay for abortion. • Outside the abortion context, neither bill has adequate conscience protection for health care providers, plans or employers. • These two bills must now be combined into one bill that both the House and Senate will vote on in final form. Provisions against abortion funding and in favor of conscience protection, affordability, and immigrants' access to health care must be part of a fair and just health care reform bill, or the final bill must be opposed.
