The Word of God

Choose one of next Sunday's readings. One person reads the scripture aloud as others are attentive to a word, phrase, or theme that is meaningful to them. Allow for a minute of silent reflection. Have another person read the same scripture a second time.

Faith Sharing

Begin with an open ended question such as "What strikes you from this reading?" and/or you can use the "Reflection Question" found on our website or bulletin. Allow time for reflection & sharing.

Closing Prayer

At the end of the faith sharing, invite participants to pray aloud for any particular petitions or praises they may have. Feel free to close with: The Lord's Prayer or Spontaneous prayers or a faith-based song.

Reflection Question for Next Sunday, March 21, 2010

Jesus calls us to have unconditional love for our brothers and sisters, like he shows for each one of us. Sometimes, though, we confuse love with approval. Jesus is able to love without condoning evil. In today's Gospel, Jesus doesn't close his eyes to the sin of the woman caught in adultery, but he loves her no less and calls her to turn her life around. Is there anyone you find hard to love because their actions are unacceptable?

This announcement came after a two year examination process instituted by the Archdiocese in an effort to make our Catholic school system stronger and poised for the future.

Thankfully, St. Louis School is not being affected by the closings/consolidations. We continue to thrive, having received an outstanding Factors of Viability assessment from the Archdiocesan visiting team this past fall. Our enrollment is strong and we have been busily guiding tours for prospective families throughout our admissions process.

With that being said, many in our own community have been affected by this consolidation. Our prayers are with the children, families, faculties, and staffs of those schools impacted. We welcome those families that may be re-evaluating their school choices to come and take a tour and see all that St. Louis has to offer for a comprehensive, faith-based education that nurtures the whole child. THE 2010 CENSUS: WHAT'S IN IT FOR YOU? As members of this faith-based community and the communities in which we live and work, each of us has a lot at stake as we prepare to complete our 2010 Census form. By participating, we can affect the quality of life in our community for the better. Every year, the federal government distributes more than \$400 billion to state, local and tribal governments based on census data – funding used for new roads, schools, hospitals and to enhance important community programs. Faith organizations like ours use census data to apply for grants that fund programs and initiatives that are important to our community.
