Sit with the passage as one would with a good friend- not just thinking or analyzing, but instead remaining in a quiet, listening spirit, so the word can nurture and challenge you.

The Word of God

Choose one of next Sunday's readings. One person reads the scripture aloud as others are attentive to a word, phrase, or theme that is meaningful to them. Allow for a minute of silent reflection. Have another person read the same scripture a second time.

Faith Sharing

Begin with an open ended question such as "What strikes you from this reading?" and/or you can use the "Reflection Question" found on our website or bulletin. Allow time for reflection & sharing.

Closing Prayer

At the end of the faith sharing, invite participants to pray aloud for any particular petitions or praises they may have. Feel free to close with: The Lord's Prayer or Spontaneous prayers or a faith-based song.

Dear Parishioners:

I am pleased on this Palm Sunday to welcome Bishop Rozanski to our parish. Bishop Rozanski will be celebrating the 9:30 am Mass for us—it is always a joy to have him present in our midst. A big St Louis welcome to our Vicar Bishop.

You may have already noted that we began removing the home on the Ten Oaks Road property that the parish purchased last summer. Once the house is completely removed, the property will be graded and seeded so that it can be used as a playfield for our children. In accord with our master plan, adopted 12 years ago, that property will also be the location of our proposed new gym.

This year's Italian Dinner was a huge success. Preliminary stats indicate that we had over 350 workers for the whole weekend, serving as setup and cleanup committees, kitchen help, bussers (over 100 in 3 shifts), servers, hosts, drinks, salads, desserts, sauce stirrers and more. It is always such a great joy to see so many of our young people working together and enjoying themselves. I've said so often: "we have the best youth in the entire world at St Louis." And they proved it again at this year's dinner.

The dinner grossed \$13,339 which is an increase over last year. In addition 150 more meals were served than two years ago—all pointing to a fantastic, successful day in all respects. A huge THANK YOU and CONGRATULATIONS to all who made it the best Italian Dinner we've ever had!

Finally, as we enter into Holy Week, I sincerely wish you a blessed week. I encourage you to make it a meaningful week by participating in one or all of our Holy Week Celebrations which recall the last days of Our Lord's life before His Resurrection.
