#### The Word of God

Choose one of next Sunday's readings. One person reads the scripture aloud as others are attentive to a word, phrase, or theme that is meaningful to them. Allow for a minute of silent reflection. Have another person read the same scripture a second time.

#### Faith Sharing

Begin with an open ended question such as "What strikes you from this reading?" and/or you can use the "Reflection Question" found on our website or bulletin. Allow time for reflection & sharing.

#### Closing Prayer

At the end of the faith sharing, invite participants to pray aloud for any particular petitions or praises they may have. Feel free to close with: The Lord's Prayer or Spontaneous prayers or a faith-based song.

#### Reflection Question for Next Sunday, February 12, 2012

Pay attention to the interplay between the 1<sup>st</sup> reading and the Gospel. Moses lays down the rules for dealing with lepers - "he shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp." What happens to Jesus after he heals the leper in the Gospel?

### LETTER TO CREATOR OF YOU TUBE VIDEO **WHY I HATE RELIGION, BUT LOVE JESUS**

Congratulations on your "Why I Hate Religion, But Love Jesus" video gone viral! Conveying a spiritual message by using media is similar to Jesus speaking in parables so people could understand about the Kingdom. Your hip hop presentation is catchy and fresh, and has begun a worldwide dialogue that may not have happened otherwise.

While I would agree with the premise that some human beings who lead organized religion are imperfect and even sinful, I would hesitate to make your assertions that all religion is to be hated or that Jesus did not desire us to gather in an organized way to share faith and love.

May I ask you, as a young adult, if you have a group of Christians who meet to pray and support each other? Do you ever gather to share a meal or break open the Word of God? Do you and your friends serve others by helping at a soup kitchen or on a mission trip? If your answer to any of these questions is yes, you have pretty much organized yourselves in a community to grow in faith, love and service. To me, this is church.

As a Catholic and as a Catholic youth minister, I am painfully aware of the prejudice, abuse, and judgments we can inflict on other people. But, just like the early Christian community who walked and talked with Jesus, we continually strive for His holiness and healing from the brokenness we have in our lives. And we don't do it alone. The literal Body of Christ was and is broken on the cross for us, the figurative Body of Christ. My own experiences of healing, peace, forgiveness, joy and love as an intimate part of the Catholic community of believers is profound. I would not have the personal relationship with Jesus today without the informal and formal relationships of this organized religion.
