

MARYLAND CATHOLIC CONFERENCE

On Monday, February 16, 60 parishioners traveled by motor coach to attend the 25th Annual Lobby Night for the Maryland Catholic Conference. After attending a briefing at Saint Mary's Church, they traveled to the Senate and House buildings to visit and speak with Delegates and Senators from districts 9A, 12 A, 12B, and 13. They spoke to them about their positions, in light of the Catholic Faith, on issues including the death penalty, marriage protection, preserving programs that serve the poor, immigration, stem cell research, the need to preserve pregnancy support centers, textbook funding for non-public schools, and the BOAST bill.

In August 2008, Saint Louis Parish threw a "convent warming" shower for the four religious sisters who had moved to the school grounds in the Fall of 2007. On September 1, the gifts were delivered in person, just days before Hurricane Hanna hit and left the school grounds under 15 feet of water!

Over 1,200 people sought refuge at Saint John's, including the second floor of the school building and the roof of another classroom building. It was very perilous for weeks while relief efforts were organized and food and water were brought to the compound. In early September, Monsignor Luca announced a poor box collection to help with the

hurricane relief efforts. An extremely generous \$44,000 was given by Saint Louis parishioners. Of this total amount, \$30,000 was directed to Catholic Relief Services, \$5000 was given to the religious sisters, \$100 was given each teacher, \$3000 was given to Food for the Poor and a stipend was given to Bishop Pean and to Father Elie.

The biggest partner in

the relief effort was Catholic Relief Services. They helped in so many ways, including helping rebuild the wall around the school and creating a storage depot so, if and when another flood strikes, supplies can be in place on the school grounds. The Catholic Daughters Court Saint Louis gave \$400 to replenish classroom supplies. During the next few months, the Sisters concentrated on cleaning up the mess and clearing tons of mud. By December, the school was back in operation!

The Haiti Ministry sponsored an engineer and an electrician to conduct a needs assessment for the school after the flood and to design an electrical system. A medical doctor from Saint Louis also visited. One of the sisters was very sick when he arrived. She was treated and quickly regained her health.

This summer, a parish delegation that included Fr. Jim Sorra, visited Haiti to observe the recovery efforts and marvel at all the good work the Sisters are doing with such limited resources. Saint Louis Parish continues to provide full salary support for 29 staff and teachers at Saint John's School. The members of the ministry team are grateful for everyone's support!

WELCOME HOME CATHOLICS EASTER WELCOME!!

At all Masses on Easter Sunday, the Pastoral Staff presented *Catholics Come Home*, a short video that gave



a brief history of the Catholic Church and encouraged people who may have been away from the church to come back. Monsignor Luca invited anyone in the congregation that day to come back to Saint Louis the following Tuesday evening, April 14, to be "welcomed home." The event was a success with over 10 people "coming back," to meet the Pastoral Staff and ask questions about the things that were keeping them away. It was a great example of evangelization and hospitality and the Pastoral Staff hopes to do it again in 2010.

NEW PARISHIONER WELCOME

On the third Sunday of each month, the Welcoming Team hosts a get-together for all who want to join our parish family. The group gathers in the Pastoral Center Social Hall after the 11:15 Mass to introduce themselves to each other, get an overview of the history of the parish and learn about parish ministries. New Parishioner Welcome is a chance for people to get acquainted with each other and the volunteers who are involved in parish ministry. Last year, 163 individuals or families attended the Welcome Sessions. They came from as far away as California to just down the street from the church in Clarksville!

Music Ministries

Saint Louis Parish offers a number of ways for parishioners with musical talents to share their gifts with the parish community. There is music at each of the weekend Masses except the 6:45 AM Sunday Mass. At the 9:30 AM Mass, the Contemporary Music Group, a group of over 20 youth and adults led by Leo Rudegeair, sings and plays for the Glory of God each Sunday. At the 11:15 AM Mass the Saint Louis Choir sings under the direction of Saint Louis Director of Music, Paul J. Carroll.

In addition to the 11:15 AM Mass, the Choir sings a number of times throughout the year. During the 2008-09 year, the Saint Louis Choir sang:

- † At the Basilica of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Baltimore in October 2008;
- † At the December Christmas 2008 Concert which included the Saint Louis School Middle School Chorus;




2009 Clarksville Picnic

ACTS RETREAT – ADORATION, COMMUNITY, THEOLOGY, SERVICE

The ACTS movement was started in San Antonio, Texas in 1987 to help build a community of faith within parishes and, since then, has grown to build a community of faith within the entire Catholic community. The first Saint Louis ACTS retreats for men and women were held in September 2008. The participants learned at the time that the "movement" was much more than a retreat.

Over 50 men and women participated in each retreat. The groups went away for a weekend, prayed and shared their faith experiences. Since the fall retreat, several smaller groups have formed where the members participate in prayer, faith sharing, bible study and book reading. The groups were formed to give an opportunity to grow in faith personally, and to develop a stronger faith community. Fellowship is a key component in the ACTS community. Members support each other in times of need, like a funeral for a parent or in times of joy like a graduation ceremony.

Last year, the ACTS community held two fundraisers; a bake sale and a coffeehouse, "Saint Louis Unplugged," to help with for retreat expenses and to provide ACTS retreat scholarships. Both were a tremendous success and not just financially! Most importantly, they were experiences of *community*. The joyous attendance was very moving.



In the spirit of community, nine ACTS brothers and I journeyed to Pennsylvania on Pentecost weekend to raft the challenging "Lower Yough." Bibles and books on theology abounded. While some of us stole away for a brief reading or reflection, it was in the sharing of our faith journey where we able to recognize and experience Christ's love for us. Sunday morning we celebrated the Eucharist at St Mary's Church in Cumberland before returning home.

After Sunday Masses groups of people stayed in the Pastoral Center Social Hall and enjoyed fresh muffins, banana bread, cookies, coffee, and conversation. The coffeehouses, held twice last year, featured very talented, home-grown artists and were the *talk of the town—parish town*, that is. The February 2008 "Saint Louis Unplugged" was filled to capacity: Jazz, Broadway show tunes, folk, classical guitar, danceable rock, tasty refreshments, interesting people — What more could one want? One woman, upon her departure at the end of the evening, exclaimed "Are we allowed to have this much fun at church?" Fr. Dominique answered, "Allowed? Not only allowed, but encouraged."

Some retreatants get a gentle renewal of their faith. Some experience an explosive awakening of the Spirit. And for others, it's somewhere in between. For me, I was surprised to see so many men dealing with the same issues that I was dealing with and relieved to see that they were dealing with their issues the way a Catholic man is supposed to deal with tough issues."

SCIENCE AND RELIGION FORUM

On September 21, Saint Louis held its first Science and Religion Forum in the Pastoral Center Social Hall. Organized by Fr. Jim Sorra and parishioner, John Tesk, the forum was very well received by the over 200 parishioners and others of other faiths who came from the surrounding community. Dr. William D. Phillips, a recipient of the 1997 Nobel Peace prize in Physics addressed the question – "Does science make belief in God obsolete"? – during his talk, "Ordinary Faith, Ordinary Science." Dr. Phillips was an engaging and affable speaker whose talk helped strengthen the faith and resolve of those in attendance. The Science and Religion Forum hopes to become an annual event at Saint Louis.

COFFEE AND CONVERSATION

Another way Saint Louis Parish reached out to offer opportunities for adults to learn more about their Catholic Faith was through "Coffee and Conversation," a series of five talks hosted by Fr. Dominique Peridans. Forty people, on average, attended and participated in the following lively discussions:

A Pilgrim's Reflection


In May of this year, we had the opportunity to travel with Monsignor Luca and fellow pilgrims to the Holy Land. Traveling through Israel and Jordan we encountered people, sights, and experiences which reflected, on many levels, God's awesome creation and love for us all. The journey allowed us the gift of actually walking in the footsteps of Jesus, his family and his followers. Because the land is so ancient, we were blessed to admire amazing vistas, such as a sunrise across the Sea of Galilee, which are virtually unchanged since Jesus gazed at them over 2000 years ago.

As we visited numerous holy places including the sites of the Annunciation, Nativity,

Crucifixion, and Ascension, it became quite evident that we would never again read Scripture in quite the same way. Mass together each day, reading Scripture at holy places, the opportunity to pray Evening Prayer together before we gathered for dinner, and to routinely pray for the petitions that others entrusted to us brought us into a closer relationship with God and each other. We were blessed to have among many life changing experiences: our renewal of Baptismal vows at the Jordan River, our renewal of wedding vows and blessings for those called to single life at Cana, prayers for dearly departed spouses of fellow travelers at the Mount of Beatitudes, hearing the Gospel read as we floated in the otherwise silent center of the Sea of Galilee, as well as a very exciting descent on horseback into Petra, understandably one of the Seven Wonders Of the World.

Catholic Youth Ministry

HIGH-LI

High-LI is a week-long whirlwind of ministry training, leadership exercises, community building, outreach, and of course, prayer. Sleep was something nice to think about during the program, but it might have only happened once or twice.

The program for the youth of the Archdiocese of Baltimore is broken down into three different "tracks" which focused on different components of ministry: "Emmaus" was oriented around peer ministry, and much time was spent on learning about prayer services and small "warmer" games to bring the community together. "Acts 29" was directed at making young persons

good formal church leaders, and they put the participants to the test through what were basically "town meetings" of the whole program as well as organizing larger community activities. "Source and Summit" was all about liturgy and prayer. Those who were in this track learned all about how to put a plan for a mass together in addition to gaining musical skills aimed at being a good cantor.

Each track also had a public speaking assignment that was to be written prior to arrival at the retreat house. Emmaus participants were required to write a "witness talk" about one of four themes: recognizing, listening, interpreting,

or responding to God. Acts 29 asked for a speech about those people in an individual's life that acted as prophets for them. Source and Summit people had to write an original list of petitions and choose a song to sing. Each High-LI

participant was required to perform their talk, speech, or petitions and song in front of a camera and veteran public speakers in order to create more efficient deliverers of messages in both formal and informal settings.

The community that formed over the seven days of intense activity would amaze almost

anyone. When a group of similar-minded people gather in order to help each other reach a common goal, (in this case, becoming better church leaders and disciples of Jesus Christ,) lifelong friendships form almost effortlessly. It would be great if our world could be a never-ending High-LI!

SUMMIT LAKE

When spring rolls around, I can tell you that there's one thing on Saint Louis CYM's mind: the annual retreat known simply as "Summit Lake". Nestled in the idyllic mountains of Emmitsburg, there is a retreat center that has no doubt changed hundreds of lives... Saint Louis has been using it for years as a spiritual ignition point for confirmandi, but many also go just to pour fuel on the fire of their love for our Lord. Each year, most participants of Summit Lake are experiencing

their very first retreat... and many times, their first close encounter with God. It's incredible to see the transformation that takes place in just 3 days: when everyone first shows up for the bus in the Bishop D room, there is either no interaction or only interaction with already well-established friends... but once the realization that it's safe to open up sets in, (usually by the next morning,) transformations really begin. When the buses pull back into Clarksville, there are usually plenty of tears over leaving people that one has just met. Apart from the social transformation, there is the potentially radical spiritual change... Someone who may have felt disconnected from God, or may not have even really believed in Him is ready to lector at the next daily mass! Like I said: incredible. The best thing about the retreat really is the difference in people's attitudes toward sincerity. It's a wonderful feeling to know that someone you

WORK CAMP

The teenagers worked hard through out the week to build wheelchair ramps, install installation, mount siding, and perform in whatever they were called upon to do. These high school students ranging from sophomores to seniors were all volunteers giving up a week of their summer to serve in the image of God and to try to make this world a better place.

The students were not only build houses for the less fortunate, but to build up their faith in God. The weeks theme was the song," If I Had Wings," by Darius Rucker. This song reflects on the things wrong with the world and how we as Catholics can try to fix these unjust problems one person at a time. Dr. Pat Sprankle and his team of adult ministers shared their journeys of faith with the teens. CONFIRMATION PROCESS

This November 152 high school students will be fully initiated into the Catholic Church and will be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit at their Confirmation. These Candidates have been preparing for Confirmation by attending religious education classes through 10th grade and will now be Confirmed in their junior year. The actual Confirmation program began last February. As a part of the Confirmation program Candidates have completed ten service hours to act as Christian witnesses both in our parish and the community. Along with service developing a life of prayer is also an important part of the program. All of the Confirmation Candidates have attended one of three Confirmation retreats where they go away and experience Christ through the sacraments, talks,

We not only grew in our relationships with each other, but also grew in our relationship with God. Our faith lives bloomed immensely, from listening to different speakers at Catechetical sites, to rocking out to Christian Singer Matt Maher, to watching the Pope zoom by in his Pope-mobile, to participating in an overnight Vigil at Randwick Racecourse, complete with the entire congregation of 4,000,000 carrying lit candles. We not only toured the beautiful beaches and Taronga Zoo, but also Saint Mary's Cathedral and various other churches all around Sydney. It was amazing to see how many people from all the different countries celebrating our same faith and praising the same Lord! SUMMER 2008





The Children's Chapel is a unique way for families with toddlers and small children to celebrate Mass at Saint Louis. The chapel simulcasts the Mass as it is being celebrated in the church. It is a great way for parents to teach their young children about Mass. The Children's Chapel is open during the 4:00 PM Saturday, 9:30 AM Sunday and 11:15 Sunday Masses.




